Overview

Building on previous School Travel Planning (STP) work in the area, project partners are developing a new Walking School Bus (WSB) program specifically tailored for smaller rural communities as well as other resources to promote safe, active travel to school.

Project highlights

- » New WSB routes established in Brockville, Smiths Falls and Mississippi Mills for the journey to school.
- » Developing a video that will form part of a curriculum-based pilot program to teach pedestrian safety to students. Project team members have also provided feedback on safe routes to school for the City of Brockville's Active Transportation Plan.
