Budget \$240,000 (\$100,000 OAST Fund + \$140,000 matching local support)

Overview

Building on a previous pilot, the project will introduce School Travel Planning to select schools across North Bay from three school boards and align with the city's new Active Transportation Master Plan.

Project highlights

- » School-level surveys have identified various priorities including new bike racks, painted crosswalks, improved sidewalk maintenance, introduction of communal bus stops, and a potential new partnership with the YMCA to offer a walk to school program.
- » New engagement strategies are strengthening parent involvement in promotional events, cycling skills training, and walkabouts to assess walking conditions near schools.
