#### **Overview**

The project introduced School Travel Planning (STP) to Blind River as a pilot for other communities in the East Algoma region. A new active school travel (AST) steering committee worked to strengthen local coordination and sustainability.

## Project highlights

- Implemented STP at three schools through a community-wide action plan that addressed safety and other barriers to AST. Measures included mapping routes, recruiting volunteers to lead walk-to-school groups, and delivering cycling skills training.
- » Improved infrastructure by installing new bike racks and bike repair stations in key locations as well as adding new signage and crosswalks in school zones.
