Overview

The Walk or Wheel Thunder Bay (WOW TB) project developed school travel plans at four schools and delivered city-wide active school travel events. Strengthening collaboration among local stakeholders and creating a program sustainability plan were also priorities.

Project highlights

- » Created a video series profiling School Travel Planning champions to celebrate success and build momentum.
- » A new WOW TB Committee improved cooperation between and commitment to active school travel among local partners.
- » Implemented infrastructure changes to school grounds and surrounding streets including installing bike racks, adding curb cuts and introducing wayfinding signs on key routes to five schools.
